Final year (Top-up) Degree

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Version 4.0 – January 2009

1. Am I qualified for the final year (top-up) degree programme?

Qualified candidates for the final year BSc Aviation management are as follow:

- Commercial Pilots with a frozen ATPL
- Aircraft Maintenance Engineering Licence (LAME) with a minimum of one aircraft type and one year of experience, or
- Holding of Higher National Diploma in Aviation Management, or equivalent

2. How much will it cost to enroll in the programme?

The total cost of the final year (top-up) BSc in Aviation Management is **AED 50,000** for Emirates Group (including DNATA) and **AED 60,000** for others. Also, there is a one off registration fee (one time) for enrollment.

3. How can I pay?

Payments can be made directly to the cashier of EAC during the enrollment process. EK staff, may pay by monthly salary deduction on a 12 months spread.

4. Are other members of my family entitled to discounts?

If you are an Emirates Group staff member, your direct members of the family are also entitled to the Emirates special price. These are applicable to wife/ husband/ children/ parents/ brothers and sisters ONLY.

5. Is there any scholarships and if yes, how can I apply?

EAC does not offer any scholarships for this programme.

6. What are the entry requirements?

The entry requirements are as stated in paragraph 1. More over, for those whose first language is not English or whose previous qualifications was not taught and assessed in English must provide evidence of attainment in English Language by achieving an IELTS score of at least 6.5 or an equivalent qualification.

7. If necessary, where can I perform my entry requirement English test?

It is up to the candidate to find in Dubai a certified place where he can perform an exam and obtain the necessary minimum qualifications. The British Council would be keen to help with some advice on that.

8. How can I enroll in the programme?

There are two possible ways. By filling and submitting an on-line application form (please, visit the EAC website to download or fill-in and submit the form) or you should contact EAC, South Campus, Admission and Registration office, Ms. Shereen Afana on Tel. 2189104 or by email: shereen.afana@emirates.com.

9. After completion, who will award the BSc degree?

The BSc degree will be awarded by Coventry University (British University) and the course is fully accepted and recognized by the, QAA (Quality Assurance Agency), UK authorities.

10. Where can I get more information about Coventry University?

11. How will classes be delivered?

Classes will be delivered on a block mode. This means through batches of typically 5 to 6 consecutive days of intensive teaching/ activities with breaks in between. Each block would cover one module and span for a period of approximate 9 weeks. There will be a total of six modules in order to complete the top-up degree.

12. Do I have to attend all the assigned classes?

It is highly recommended that all candidates must attend the assigned classes. Assessment of candidate performance for most of the modules is based on a combination of exams and projects.

13. When and where will classes start?

Classes are held as per the provided schedule from the Registrar. Classes will be taken at EAC, Dubai, at the Emirates Aviation Training Centre (Aircraft Shape Building).

14. What is the final deadline for applying for this programme?

Each new batch has its own deadline. Please check with Admission and Registration office.

15. What are the recommended readings and textbooks for this programme?

A selection of recommended books per module is available in the library.

16. Do I need to buy any books, or is the price of the books already included in my fees?

The fees do not cover textbooks. EAC, although recommending the essential readings, does not impose on students to buy any textbooks. It is up to the individual students to decide if they want to buy certain books to follow up their modules.
